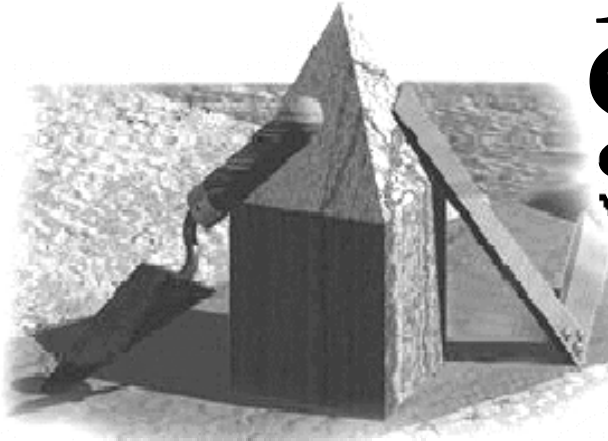

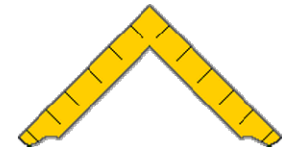
Worshipful Master

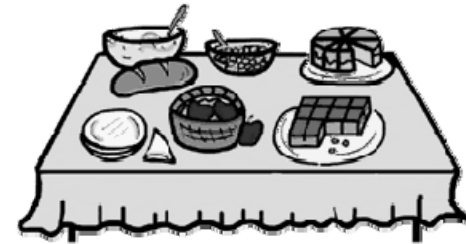
